FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Good afternoon and welcome to today's game against Doncaster. I also welcome Gary, his staff and players to Brunton Park for what we know will be another good test.

They come into this game having lost just one of their last four league games, and I was there to watch the defeat they suffered at Hartlepool. I'm sure they will count themselves unlucky at having ended up on the wrong side of that result, with them having had the bulk of the possession.

We know the strengths they have and the threats we will face but, as ever, it's about us and what we do that matters. We've seen in our recent games that if we're on it from the first whistle we're a match for anyone.

The draw at home with Crewe was one where once again we couldn't fault anyone for effort and commitment, but the quality was lacking at key moments, and that affected the overall performance. We asked for a response going into the weekend trip to Hartlepool, knowing that it was a big game for our fans, as well as for ourselves.

Going into half time it was obviously disappointing to be behind, but we said in the dressing room that it was there for us if we kept doing what we were doing. I asked the players to visualise what it would be like to be celebrating a victory in front of that away support, who were absolutely magnificent from the minute we came out to start the warm-up.

The response was that the players showed real belief in themselves, and along with that came the ruthlessness that tends to bring goals. All three of the finishes were good for different reasons, and the end result was one we all felt we thoroughly deserved.

What we want now is to find the consistency that will bring that level of performance in every game. We know we have the quality and ability, and now it's a case of knitting that together with the belief in themselves and in what they're trying to do as a team.

I keep saying this, but so far we've done alright. We've been OK. Again, I've told the players that they're right on the brink of being very good. The league position means nothing at this stage of the season, other than confirming that it has been ok.

We'll always demand more, that's how it has to be. We all have to make sure that we get better and better in everything we do. If we're doing that then we'll be giving ourselves a chance.

Carlisle did the ugly stuff in every area of the pitch and then played their football as they took the spoils on an excellent night of League Two football at Brunton Park.

The early possession belonged to the Blues and a high ball into the area caused more problems as Raynes nodded it down. O'Sullivan set himself but Blair was back to help out and he hooked it away before a shot could be taken.

The teams cancelled each other out for a long spell but Williams got another sight of goal when Coppinger swung the ball into the mix. The late arriving striker was frustrated when he miscued his volley right at Gillespie.



The scare woke the hosts up and they struck in style when O'Sullivan ghosted off his marker and screamed for the ball. He took a touch and sent a long delivery to the back stick where **Nicky Adams** had been left completely unmarked. The nippy midfielder reshaped his body and bagged his second goal of the campaign with a superbly executed volley.

It was suddenly end-to-end and clever play from Proctor released Lambe as he ran from deep.

He got there first but Lawlor had set himself to make a two-handed save as he raced off his line.

The Cumbrians kept things calm after the break as they worked their way back on top and it needed an excellent save from Lawlor to prevent Brisley from doubling the lead when he got on the end of an outswinging corner from Adams. It was going in until the stopper somehow clawed it off the line with an acrobatic jump.

O'Sullivan flashed a shot into the side netting at one end, and Coppinger drilled one across the face of goal at the other, as both sides worked hard to make their possession count.

United should have scored with 15 minutes left to play when Joyce rattled an excellent cross into the area. Raynes was up to meet it but he somehow sent his header over the target from right beneath the bar.

Persistence paid off late in the day when substitute Jabo Ibehre was left to run clear after a smooth piece of approach play from Devitt and Jones. The big man thundered a low ball across the face of goal and Mason could do nothing as it stuck between his heels and then rolled over the line to give Carlisle their well-deserved second.

A gung-ho approach brought a consolation for the visitors as a late set piece was rifled into the area. Rowe got enough on it to rob Gillespie of his clean sheet.

For my first connection today, I am remembering that Doncaster Belles used to be one of the top womens' football teams. That gives me a belated opportunity to congratulate the England Women on winning the Euros.

Perhaps appropriately this win came about 100 years after womens' football was banned from the grounds of FA member clubs. From the 1860s, some 'ladies' had ignored ridicule and disapproval by playing football, but it was not until the First World War that the women's game became popular with teams from munitions factories like Preston-based Dick, Kerr Ladies, who attracted huge crowds and raised over £70,000 for charity.

In July 1970 an unofficial England team competed in the first 'World Cup', organised by the Federation of Independent European Female Football and finished 4th out of 7. Parliament passed the Sex Discrimination Act in 1975 but it was not until 1992 that the FA at last accepted football for women, allowing them to play on member clubs' turf. In June 1995, promoting the Womens' World Cup, FIFA President Sepp Blatter famously said, "The future is feminine".

Now, back to the mens' game and our visitors, Doncaster Rovers. Their initial Football League career was very much start/stop. Joining Division 2 in 1901 they came 7th but failed to gain re-election at the end of the next season, a bit tough after finishing 16th out of 18.

Re-elected in 1904 they were promptly discarded again at the end of that season, having finished last with only 8 points. Like Carlisle they missed the first few seasons of the old Div 3 North but joined in 1923 when two clubs were added to bring it up to 22, like the three other divisions.

United joined in 1928 and have since met Rovers on and off, with more or less a 50-50 wins record.

Doncaster won through to the play-off final at Wembley in 2008 and Carlisle hoped to join them but a stoppage time Leeds goal at Brunton Park on May 15th scuppered that plan. After selling programmes

and Golden Gambles that evening I had sneaked into a box via the restaurant but when the previously incognito Leeds fans in our home areas celebrated their winning goal, I walked out in disgust, straight into a TV film crew.

After muttering a few curses about the game, I got my act together and said how much I had enjoyed watching a great season until that last few minutes. I didn't see breakfast telly next day but those who did said it was okay. It was a small consolation when Doncaster beat Leeds 1-0 in the Final.

Chris Balderstone played for Doncaster on the evening of 15 September 1975 after scoring a half century that afternoon for Leicestershire which earned the bonus batting points required to win the County Championship. Yes, that's the **Chris Balderstone** † who was such a hero in Carlisle, with 419 appearances in ten seasons from 1965, a classy footballer and an elegant cricketer.
