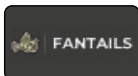

FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

A warm Brunton Park welcome to the directors, staff and players from Harrogate as they join us today.

It's always good to see Paul Thirlwell, he was here to watch our game against Barrow on Tuesday, and we were able to look back and have a chat about his days as captain of our club. They've had a tough run of results recently but they always provide a stern test. I am sure that will be the same this afternoon.

Seeing a crowd of over nine thousand on Tuesday was fantastic for everybody. It really shows that the work Paul, his staff and team are doing is appreciated. The results that have led to this are a reward for all of the hard work on and off the pitch, and long may it continue.

I have to commend Paul, Greg Abbott and the other staff involved in recruitment for the calm way in which they handled this winter transfer window. The confidence from that took us to Rochdale last weekend and a much grittier display was required. The players had to scrap, having scored the early goal, and often against some very strange refereeing decisions.

The celebrations in front of another huge travelling support were amazing to see. We had over 40% of the crowd on the day, and the noise was incredible. We thank you all for the way you are getting behind the team and the manager.

On to the Barrow game and the support coupled with the performance made it a special night. The second half was clinical and we could have scored more. Credit goes to everybody for what was a very enjoyable game.

Now it's on to today and hopefully more for us to be cheering about come full time.

FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Good afternoon and welcome to our latest home game against Harrogate Town. I also welcome Simon, his staff and players to Brunton Park today.

We come up against a Harrogate side that I have no doubt will be looking to get back to winning ways as quickly as possible. As we saw at their place earlier in the season, it's a squad that has some good players and they can cause real problems if they're allowed to build up any kind of momentum.

I know I keep repeating this but, as ever, it comes down to us and how we go about things. If we're right, and if we do our jobs, we've shown that we can cause problems as well.

I think it's important again to mention the level of support, with the home crowd against Hartlepool setting the tone for the last few weeks. The noise was incredible during that game, everybody was up for it and that kind of atmosphere really gives the players a lift.

It was the same again at Rochdale with nearly half the crowd from Cumbria. Seeing that as you come out of the tunnel adds a real sense of energy and drive, and the support from the moment we kicked off was unrelenting. Being able to send everybody home happy with a win that had to be fought for was a great reward come the end of the day.

On to the Barrow game and it became quickly apparent through Monday and Tuesday that it was going to be a much bigger than normal crowd,

but to see over nine thousand on the night was just fantastic. We had to work hard through the first part of the game but we tweaked things, got our first goal at a really good time, and from there I thought we were ruthless.



We saw the players feeding off the level of support, and vice versa, and if we can keep this level of togetherness in everything we do then we're going to give ourselves a fighting chance.

Again, as we've said before, we're in a good position, but nothing has been achieved yet. We have to keep taking each game as it comes, keep doing things properly every day, and let's just see where it takes us.

The players have shown real focus through the first 28 games of the season, and it has to be the same through the remaining 18. It isn't easy, nobody will give us anything on a plate, and that's why we have to keep standards high. That's what we'll be looking to do as we go on from here.

Enjoy the game.

United went into their penultimate home game of the 2020/21 season knowing exactly what they had to do if they were to keep their play-off dreams alive.

It was the visitors who appeared to have taken the lead on eight minutes when Stead slowed his run to beat the offside trap, as Muldoon clipped it through from a fortunate midfield ricochet. The big striker went round the keeper and rolled the ball into the net, but referee Chris Sarginson walked across to consult his assistant. A brief conversation was followed by the raising of the offside flag.

But Harrogate were ahead on 11 minutes when Thomson was given space inside the area. His cross was blocked, but it spun awkwardly and Farman was out to chase it down. Jack Muldoon got there first, and his low toe poke somehow twisted its way from a very tight angle across the goal line. It hit the inside of the post and the spin took it away from Hayden and into the nets.

Carlisle crafted a bright moment when Tanner came out of his own half with the ball at his feet. He used Kayode, who stepped inside before sweeping it wide to Armer. A lobbed cross found Zanzala, and he got enough on it to send it bobbling at Alessandra, who was on the edge of the box. It wouldn't settle as it bounced high and Burrell made up the defensive yards.



It was a good spell from the Blues and play was spread to Patrick over on the right touchline. He beat his marker but a low pass was cut out.

The second half was tight but a dipping cross from Tanner was nodded wide by Walker as Carlisle continued to probe, and Patrick had another stinger blocked when he let fly from 22-yards.

Carlisle were back on terms moments later when Guy sent a beauty of a free kick into the mix. **Joshua Kayode** † got the touch it needed and it flew past Cracknell and into the top corner, making it seven for the season for the Rotherham loanee.


The hosts were the width of the woodwork away from taking a late lead when Scott burst into the box from a Patrick flick. A low cross was met by Burrell, but his hurried clearance hit a sharp angle off his boot. He was relieved to see it bounce back off the bar.

Tony was a huge supporter of the club and worked part-time, full-time and in a voluntary capacity in a number of roles for close to 40 years for the Blues.



A proud Yorkshireman he became an adopted Cumbrian on his move to Carlisle, and an invaluable member of the backroom team at Brunton Park, first forging sponsorship and partnership links with businesses across the county before joining the 1921 board as commercial director.

He is missed, loved, and remembered every day by all those closest to him.

For Lisa, Carlisle United meant days in the Warwick Road End as a teenager, later standing in the Paddock with her husband, then sitting in the Pioneer Stand with her young children, and later watching proudly when her sons were mascots as their dad was back in the day.

She went to the old Wembley, the Millennium Stadium, and the new Wembley, along with many less glamorous venues following our team.

On her wedding day, she wore a dress designed around the deckchair shirt. Carlisle United was a big part of her life.

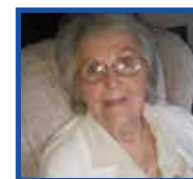

Twenty years ago on Tuesday 4 February 2003, Lincoln City came to Brunton Park and inflicted a 4-1 drubbing on a Carlisle team managed by Roddy Collins. Were you one of the 3567 in the crowd for that Nationwide Division 3 game?

We've seen a lot of changes in the football world since then, or have we? Arsenal were top of the FA Barclaycard Premiership but Manchester United closed the gap that night with a 1-0 win at Birmingham City. On their way to the title, Alex Ferguson's team overtook the Gunners on 12 April after a 6-2 win at Newcastle, who themselves had an otherwise very satisfactory season and finished third.

Before the Lincoln defeat, Carlisle were in 19th place in Division 3, the bottom tier of the Football League and were about to slip perilously close to the relegation places. In the end Carlisle survived with 49 points, while Exeter with 48 went down to the Conference along with Shrewsbury. This was not our first narrow escape and one year later we suffered the dreaded drop, along with York City.



Harrogate Town came 6th in the Unibond League from which only the champions, Accrington Stanley won promotion to the Conference. Harrogate went into the Conference North when it was founded in 2004 and won the 2018 play-offs to go up to what

was by then named the National League, winning a further promotion, also via the play-offs, in 2020 to join EFL2. They won the 2019/20 Builderbase FA Trophy as well, though the Final was delayed by Covid restrictions and played behind closed doors at Wembley in May 2021.

Over the past 20 years, close on 100 clubs have come to Brunton Park for league games. We think of Leicester City, Southampton, Norwich City, Bournemouth, Brentford, Nottingham Forest, Leeds United, Wolverhampton Wanderers and the two

Sheffield clubs as Premier or at least Championship level but they all played here when the Blues were in the third tier from 2006 to 2014. At the other end of the spectrum, in season 2004/5, the Conference fixture list included Canvey Island, Leigh RMI, Woking, Gravesend & Northfleet, Tamworth, Northwich Victoria and Farnborough as well as a dozen or so clubs whom we have met before or since in the EFL.

Carlisle fans have enjoyed four Trophy finals including the Wembley triumph of 2011 against Brentford and have gone down, up, up and down to be again in tier four.

Finally, a check on the other Division 3 visitors to Brunton Park in 2002/3. Hartlepool won 3-1 on opening day and went on to gain automatic promotion. Rochdale won 2-0, their second goal scored by Paul Simpson – I wonder what became of him? United's best win was 3-0 against Leyton Orient. AFC Bournemouth are now in the Premier League with Hull and Swansea in the Championship. Six went down to the Conference but are now in League One – Lincoln City, Oxford United, Cambridge United, Bristol Rovers, Exeter and Shrewsbury.

The others - Rushden & Diamonds, Wrexham, Scunthorpe, Bury, Torquay, York, Kidderminster, Darlington, Boston, Macclesfield and Southend have since lost EFL status though maybe Wrexham will make it back this year. Who will be in tier four in 2043?

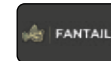
