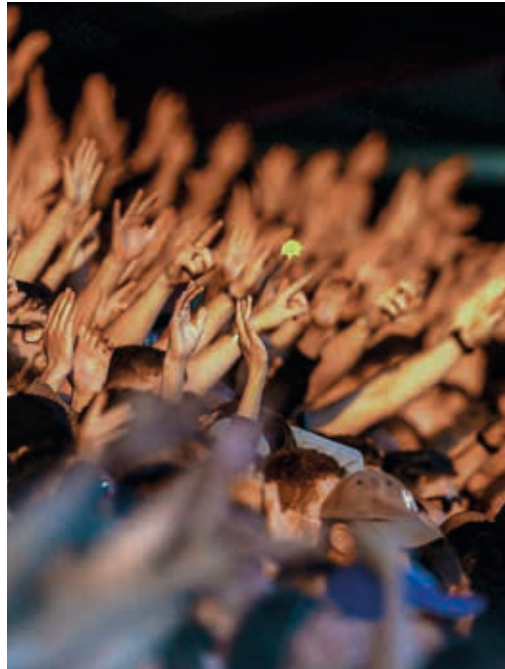
A message about anti-social and criminal behaviour

FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Good afternoon and welcome to our first home game of the New Year against Newport County. I also welcome Graham, his staff, and players to Brunton Park today.

Graham came into the job at Rodney Parade in October and picked up some good results leading up to the festive period. He was a player and captain for me at Shrewsbury, someone who was a real leader on and off the pitch, and I'm not surprised his team is proving to be hard to beat.

They were at Rochdale on Saturday, with the result there making it four draws in a row. I'm sure under Graham they'll be looking to push on through this second half of the campaign.

With our game against Hartlepool postponed we made sure we used the week after the Doncaster game to good effect. It gave us an opportunity to get some decent work into the legs and lungs for those who hadn't been getting 90 minutes and, for the players who had been involved in that run of three games in six days, they got some important recovery time along with some focused training sessions.

This week we were once again into the structured preparation we have for any game, with the focus very much on this fixture from the moment we got back together on Monday. Our weeks are always planned towards hitting a peak at 3pm on Saturday, or at 7.45pm on a Tuesday night, so a weekend with no game does little to affect that.

The transfer window is always a topic that gets raised whenever I sit down with the press and I always think

it's better not to comment on every rumour, or give too many updates, unless we're at a point where something is concrete. Constant responses to questions about moves in or out only serves to cause confusion that isn't needed, in my opinion, so I tend to steer away from it as much as possible.



As you saw with the arrivals this week, it's much better to make sure that everything is signed and sealed before we start to let people know. I've been involved so many times in the past where something has been said only for it to fall through, or completely change direction. Rest assured that as soon as something is completed, we will let everyone know.

We're coming into an important period with a lot of games in a relatively short space of time, but we're all looking forward to it. We are working away at improving the squad, and with the injuries we've had and movement we've already seen we know where we would like to strengthen.

Hopefully, come the end of the window, we'll be in an even better place than we are now.

United's Blue Army battled their way through road closures and heavy traffic to get to Rodney Parade on Saturday afternoon, but they brushed all of that aside to take their place in the stands as usual.

The Cumbrians had a real chance early on when Back flighted a ball from the right touchline into the box. The clearance only went as far as Moxon, who opted to strike it on the volley from just inside the area. He got his bearings wrong and it spun well wide.

United went on the break when a Demetriou throw was cut out, and Dennis pushed forward with the ball at his feet. Moxon was up in support, as was Armer, but the shot was blocked just as the wing back pulled the trigger.

Clarke had to scamper to get to a deep free kick from Lewis, with meaningful attacks sporadic in their nature, and it was almost inevitable that it was going into the stands as he stretched to head it.

The opening goal of the game came from nowhere as Newport somehow made their way down the left flank, when everything seemed to be under control. Nevers wriggled away and took advantage of hesitation to pull the ball across the face of the target. Moriah-Welsh was first to react, and an ugly first touch from him caused all kinds of problems as it spun and bounced. Holy was taken out of the equation with a toe poke that sent the ball over the line.

The away side carved Newport open on 37 minutes when Moxon won a tackle deep inside his own half. He gave it to Dennis, who looked up to see Mellish on the overlap. The defender shrugged off a challenge before returning the favour with a reverse pass. Dennis was closed down just as it appeared to open up for him.

More incisive one-touch play from Carlisle saw Gibson and Dennis combine, with a low cross from the wide man sitting up nicely for the striker to hit, off a Mellish touch. It was a difficult opportunity and he struck it into the deck.

United enjoyed long periods of possession, and they got their equaliser on 75 minutes when a Guy corner was ripped into the bodies that waited. It stuck under feet, and **Corey Whelan** → didn't need to be asked twice. A thundering low punt from 14-yards bulged the net, allowing him to mark appearance number 50 for the club with his first goal in a blue shirt (or a red away one at least!).

Here at Carlisle United Community Sports Trust we run a **Football Development Scholarship in partnership with LFE (League Football Education)**.

The two-year full-time course is a BTEC Level 3 extended diploma in sports coaching, which is the equivalent of 3 A-levels. The course allows 16-19 year olds the opportunity to train like a professional footballer whilst gaining a first class education at the same time.

The course is very diverse with a variety of units that prepare learners for further education or a job in the sports industry.

Units include: Health & Wellbeing, Sport Development, Self-Employment, Sports Coaching, Sports Injuries, Nutrition, Technology in sport and many more!

Previous students have gone onto work and study in many different areas. These include going to university to do sports coaching, sports journalism, sports therapy, sports science and PE teaching.

Other learners have set up their own football coaching businesses as well going onto be personal trainers and sports coaches.

The course is fantastic for the education and football playing side however the work-based qualifications completed are also very valuable to the learners. The students will complete their FA Playmaker course as well as the FA Level One in Football Coaching.

They will also complete work placement hours with our fantastic community coaches on our comprehensive

community programme. This includes going into Primary Schools to support with delivery of PE, Premier League Primary Stars and After School Clubs.

They will also have the opportunity to help out at CUFC Soccer Schools and other programmes such as Football for All and Walking Football. Learners will also complete regular tutorials throughout the year in many different and important areas. These include car safety, drug & alcohol awareness, heart start/first aid, CV writing and other valuable topics.

These experiences play a major part in developing knowledge and key skills such as teamwork, leadership and communication, putting the learners in the best possible position for when they finish the two-year course with us.

Today we welcome Ian Arnold and Dean Walling as our hospitality guests and we look back to season 1992/93 when the pair of them appeared as 'Player Profiles' in the match day programme.

PLAYER PROFILE



DEAN WALLING

Dean Walling's most memorable footballing moment came at the mecca of English soccer when he scored at Wembley in the F.A. Vase Final. Deano as he is affectionately known arrived at Brunton Park before the start of last season as part of Aidan McCaffery's rebuilding programme. It was in effect a second opportunity for the likeable Dean to establish himself in soccer's professional ranks.

Leeds born, he began his career at Elland Road where he had been a boyhood supporter. However it didn't work out for him there and recalls vividly the gut wrenching disappointment when the club released him. But Deano is a fighter and opportunities to play presented themselves in Canada and at Rochdale. He was a firm favourite at Spotland where his whole hearted commitment made him a crowd hero. However for the man who admires the silky skills of Glen Hoddle and John Barnes the opportunity to play first team football became limited.

"When United became interested in me it seemed to be the right move. There was obviously a challenge but the club has potential," says Deano. He also recalled Eddie Gray's words "you never know what might happen tomorrow." and so he moved to Brunton Park.

As with most of the United players Deano believes the Cumbrians will surprise people this season and take a positive step towards promotion and perhaps eventually returning to his favourite ground Old Trafford.

Away from football Deano who lists sleeping as a miscellaneous like enjoys cricket, snooker and tennis. Of the future coaching football to children is one ambition but they better be on their best behaviour for Deano doesn't tolerate bad manners or smoking.

PLAYER PROFILE



IAN ARNOLD

Ian Arnold one of several early season signings hails from the soccer hot bed of the north-east. So it wasn't surprising that Ian since when he can remember only had one ambition to fulfil — to become a professional footballer. His early schoolboy promise saw him an automatic choice for his Chester-le-Street school side. However his soccer displays were not only impressing his schoolteachers but attracting the attention of several professional clubs including Middlesbrough for whom he signed schoolboy forms. Ayresome Park proved a good learning ground but first team appearances were limited to just three, the last as a substitute against Wolves in a 0-0 draw in October, 1991. At the end of that season he was released and arrived during the summer at Brunton Park for trials in which he impressed subsequently earning a contract. Perhaps it was a disappointing ending to his Middlesbrough days but there was one cherished moment — the 1990 FA Youth Challenge Cup Final against Tottenham. The London side eventually winning a highly entertaining two-legged encounter by the odd goal in five. Ian is enjoying his football with United although six of his nine appearances in the league have been as a substitute he has scored three goals and must be in consideration for an extended run. One indiscretion which Ian finds embarrassing was being booked at Rochdale before he got on the pitch.

Ian scored 11 goals in 47 games for United before joining Kettering Town in 1994. Deano made 236 appearances for the Blues between 1991 and 1997, scoring 22 goals before moving to Lincoln City.

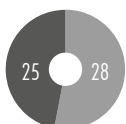

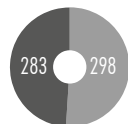

You Brunton Park season ticket holders and other home supporters must have been missing your regular Saturday 3pm games this past couple of months. Here's hoping you can enjoy this first home game of 2023.

I've followed the Blues games on Twitter while also catching up on reading some of my vast library of football books. I haven't so much collected them as never thrown any away!



On Christmas morning I was delighted to receive a copy of 'Jack's Shirt, Deano's Bottoms' by Tim Pocock. Some of you may remember a Fanzine entitled 'So Jack Ashurst' from around 30 years ago. Tim wrote and edited 15 issues of this over a four-year period.

During the first Covid lockdown in 2020 Tim scanned through 40 years of his diaries and personal match reports to start writing his 'Carlisle United memoir'. Eventually he had to halve a 200,000 word count to complete and publish his book last year.

Tim has been to more than 100 away grounds in addition to regular trips to Brunton Park from his home near Harrogate. He first saw the Blues in a game at Gillingham in 1978 when he lived in Kent, but his sometimes obsessive support for Carlisle - be honest folks, we can all be a bit obsessive in our support of the Blues - started in 1981/82.

Tim recalls the FA Cup games with Darlington and the home tie with Bishop Auckland, which was abandoned after 70 minutes on a flooded pitch and eventually played at Workington.

Bob Stokoe's Carlisle squad ended 1981 top of Division 3 but had played only 20 league games by the end of January 1982 and had to play six in February, seven in March and eight in April including his visit on the 10 April to Preston's Deepdale when 'Pop' Robson's goal was enough to earn the points.

After Wimbledon were beaten 2-1 at BP on 1 May, United had a jittery spell and passed up chances of clinching promotion at Wimbledon and at home to Bristol Rovers, before Robson again scored the only goal in the final game at bottom club Chester, to ensure United finished second equal on 80 points with champions Burnley.

During that month Tim learned quickly what it was like to be a Carlisle fan, going to away games, hitch-hiking home and experiencing a range of emotions from frustration to ecstasy.

There have been plenty of highs and lows for Tim, joined later by his son Sam, with promotions and relegations, penalty shoot-outs and Trophy Finals, all summarised in 14 chapters before the final one wittily numbered 95 which describes in detail that wonderful minute at the end of the Plymouth game on 8 May 8 1999, now celebrated as St Jimmy's Day.

Like me, Tim picks the defeat by Leeds in May 2008 as his worst moment. Since then we've had the 2014 relegation, followed by occasional hopes, sooner or later dashed, of promotion via the play-offs.

To illustrate the joy of football, Tim quotes his own description of a Danny Grainger goal, rocketing high into the net of today's visitors Newport County.



Maybe that goal is one of the forty in another recent publication - 'Bolts from the Blues' by News and Star reporter Jon Colman. I haven't seen that one yet but hope to get my hands on a copy soon.

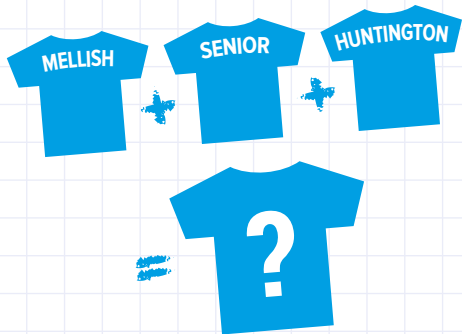

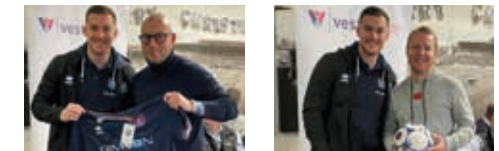
