## FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

I would like to give a warm welcome to our friends, directors, players and supporters of Rochdale Football Club - a club we have had a good relationship with, and a club once managed by Paul Simpson.

They have not had the best of starts to the season but whilst we do not wish them any bad luck, we do want the points today.

In football you get lots of knocks and I felt one was when I was informed John Halpin was going to retire from his role as Community Sports Trust manager at the end of the year.

John was first spotted by our scout Jack Watson in the Stokoe days, when he was out on loan from Celtic to Sunderland. I think the transfer fee from Celtic to Carlisle was in the £10k area, and it proved to be a bargain considering he has been at the club for nearly 40 years.

To me, John has been a great ambassador for the club and someone you loved to meet and talk to. We wish him a happy retirement, but we don't want him to leave and hope he will stay in some capacity in the future.

Talking about John; he, myself, David Wilkes and Derek Walsh are going to a memorial service in Preston this Friday to remember Clive Middlemass.

Clive evidently spoke to his family just before he died and he didn't want a traditional funeral,

but Denise his wife and son Doug have organised this for his friends to meet and show our respect for Clive.



Another visitor to the club last Saturday was Dave Rodgers, who works with the Nottingham Forest Under-23's and was running his eye over Finley Back. Clubs do this when players go out on loan to follow their progress, as do we.

He was very complimentary about the club and enjoyed the time he spent here playing 45 games under Roddy Collins at centre back.

Can I also congratulate our youth team on a really good victory last Saturday. They beat Preston, last season's divisional winners, by 2-1 despite being down to ten men for the bulk of the game.

At the time of writing these notes it is prior to the game against Manchester United Under-21's, but it looks as though the gate will be over three thousand. I know that the competition has its detractors for many reasons, but we have seen some really entertaining games in the past. Hopefully we will get more of the same this season.

## FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Welcome to our third home game in the space of a week, and congratulations to Jim on his appointment as manager of our opponents today. I'm sure it's a job he'll be looking forward to getting his teeth into quickly, and I know he'll be working hard from the off to get their season kick-started.

The clean sheet and three points last weekend were exactly what we needed and, having reviewed the game, there were plenty of other positives for us to take from it. Without properly controlling the first half, we always felt we had another gear to find at the same time as making sure that Gillingham didn't take the upper hand.

I told the players during the break that they had to lift the crowd, and I challenged them to continue to play on the front foot, but to make sure it had purpose. They produced that for us, and the goal was their reward. Jordan Gibson's run and blocked shot was followed by a determination to keep the move alive, and it's never a coincidence when good things come from that kind of approach.

With the transfer window now closed we head into the period between now and January feeling very pleased with the work we've done and with the options we have available to us. Patience was needed as we dealt with a run of injuries, but we're getting to a stage now where we have real selection headaches.

That's exactly what you want as a manager, with every player knowing that they'll be needed through what is a long season. We've had a good start, particularly here at Brunton Park, and we want to build on that as we go on from here.



An important part of doing that will be us all coming together as we tap into the positivity that has been building through the summer. There will be difficult times within games, we know that, it's how football is, but if we maintain our focus and belief we can make sure this is a really difficult place for teams to visit.

As ever, and I've said this before, we'll prepare and head into games looking to do our part within that. Putting everything into it as a team is our minimum requirement, and we've seen already that you will respond to that. Hopefully it all comes together as we look towards another positive outcome this afternoon.

**This Tuesday night fixture brought a return to Brunton Park for new manager Paul Simpson for the first time in 16 seasons with a larger than normal Tuesday night crowd caught up in the excitement of his appointment.**

Dale started well but the Cumbrians carved themselves a real chance when Guy rode a challenge in midfield. Gibson and Riley picked it up, and Patrick slid a lovely pass to Dennis. He crossed low, and it was there for Devitt to hit as he reached the edge of the area. He pulled his effort and the stopper remained untroubled.

Lynch had to react quickly to stop a drilled cross from Gibson going into the nets moments later when he appeared to be taken by surprise. Carlisle's wide man kept it low, struck it clean, and he was ready to celebrate until a firm hand scooped it off the line.

Bravery from Morgan Feeney brought a vital block when Kelly skipped through two tackles with Rochdale always dangerous in the attack. Campbell took over, but the central defender made sure he got his body in the way.

There was a stadium wide round of applause in memory of Grant Taylor on 22 minutes, and it couldn't have been any more touching when the Blues took the lead with their next attack.

A deep Jamie Devitt free kick caught Lynch out of position, and the ball slipped through his hands and onto the floor. Omari Patrick made it five for

the season when he thundered it into the roof of the net from close range.

The second half took a while to get going, but Howard had to keep his eye on a toe punt from O'Connell when he let fly on 50 minutes. It was accurate, but the gloves were sticky.

Campbell sent a fizzed shot past the angle of post and bar as Dale tried to find clear route, but Carlisle countered with a piercing run from Patrick.

That was followed by an overlap from Armer and his cross found Gibson unmarked. Parked on the penalty spot he threw a boot at it, but it angled high and into the Warwick.

The hosts were gifted a chance on 67 minutes when a loose pass was snapped up by Gibson. He came under immediate pressure and he screwed his shot wide as he thundered into the box.

Dale threw men forward but there was some excellent defending as the hosts protected their final third. Riley, Feeney and Mellish intervened, as did Whelan and Armer when high balls came their way.

United weathered the late push from the visitors and they won the game in the best way possible when Mellish mopped up an attack inside his own area. He sent it long, and Tobi Sho-Silva did the rest as he held off his marker, carried the ball forward and expertly wrapped up the points with the calmest and most accurate of finishes.

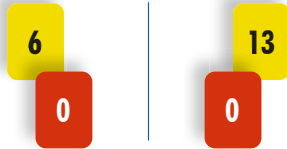

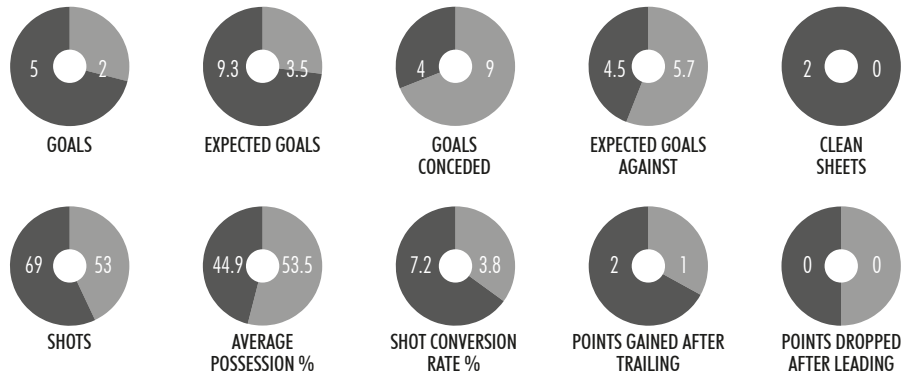


### MATCH FACTS & TOTAL CARDS

Rochdale have failed to win any of their last five league visits to Carlisle (D1 L4). Prior to this run, the Dale had won five in a row at Brunton Park in the Football League.

United and 'Dale met regularly in the old Third Division North until 1958 when after a 1-0 home win each, Rochdale came 10th with 46 points and, although only two points behind, we were 16th. They celebrated a mini 'promotion' into the new Third Division. United went into the Fourth.

I thought it might be interesting to check out the subsequent fortunes of the clubs in that 1958 Division 3 North table.

Accrington Stanley, Mansfield Town, Stockport County, Tranmere Rovers, Carlisle United, Hartlepool United and Barrow have served time in the Conference/National League, or even lower, but regained League status.

1958 champions Scunthorpe and one time high-flyers Oldham went down to the National League this year to join Halifax, Chesterfield, Wrexham, York City and Gateshead. The teams who occupied 20th to 23rd places in 1958, Darlington, Chester, Bradford Park Avenue and Southport are together in National North. Workington play in the NPL and Bury went bust.

Only Rochdale and three others, Hull City, Bradford City and Crewe Alexandra have maintained continuous Football League membership. United enjoyed a good spell through the 60s and 70s, including a season in the old First Division. Since 1986 we have been in the two bottom divisions apart from that traumatic but ultimately triumphant 2004/5 season in the Conference.

No such excitement at Spotland. Rochdale went up and down a few times between the bottom two tiers and after seven seasons in League One, dropped to League Two in 2021. They reached the final of the League Cup in its second season, 61/2 and the fifth round (last 16) of the FA Cup in 1990, 2003 and 2018, but perhaps Rochdale's greatest achievement has been survival.

It can't have been easy to attract supporters through the turnstiles in competition with a thriving Rugby League club and in the shadow of the two big Manchester clubs.

1958 was a World Cup year and unique because all four home nations qualified for the Swedish Finals. Every country played on the opening day, Sunday 8 June and 33-1 underdogs, Northern Ireland beat Czechoslovakia 1-0.

The others drew, Scotland 1-1 with Yugoslavia and Wales 1-1 with Hungary, while England fought back from two down against USSR. The Munich air crash prevented Matt Busby from fulfilling his role as Scotland manager and in his absence the Scots lost their other two games.

When the other opening games were repeated as play-offs on 17 June, England lost 1-0 but NI and Wales both won 2-1 to earn quarter-final games only two days later.

Watching tiny black and white TV images, I soon adopted the goalkeepers as my heroes, particularly Harry Gregg, hampered by a leg injury as the Irish crashed out 4-0 to France, and Wales' Jack Kelsey who defied Brazil for 73 minutes until Pele netted the only goal.

Brazil went on to notch 5-2 wins over France and Sweden to lift the trophy and the 18-year-old **Pele** was accurately identified by the world's media as the star of the future.

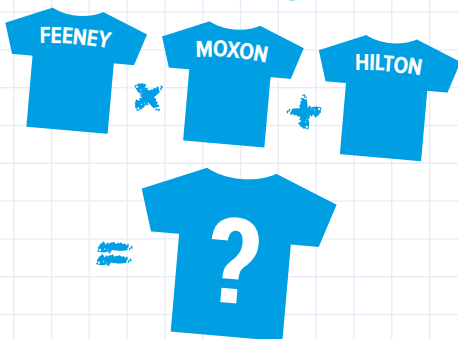
