FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

Today I welcome the directors, players and fans of Tranmere Rovers to this Emirates FA Cup tie.

Whilst I must be thankful for a home tie, it is a shame that it comes the week directly after a league match against today's opponents. I'm sure both teams will put that to one side and ensure that the excitement of the competition brings another good game.

Since the last home game against Orient we have played two fixtures, the first of which was disappointing down in Stockport. However, the second was a real tonic. I must congratulate Paul, his staff and the players for the performance against Tranmere last weekend - the way they played was exceptional. To think we had around ten players either injured or suspended, and the way we approached the game was a pleasure to watch.

I have to also include the brilliant support we got where over one thousand made the journey to Stockport and, after feeling the disappointment there, the fans followed this up with over 900 making the journey to Merseyside.

I know Paul and the players really do appreciate the fans being there and, not only that, it's also the fantastic way everyone gets behind the team. I thank you all so much.

Having mentioned our excellent support, I would remind everyone that the actions of a few can end up having real consequences for all of us. Our good reputation home and away can so easily be tarnished, as it has been in recent weeks. We are currently subject to two FA investigations for fan behaviour. This is so unfair on the vast majority who support the club and the team in the best way possible.

The authorities ask us to show what we are doing, and what we have done, to stop incidents from happening when individuals put us under the spotlight like this.

Their actions have real consequences. I ask that for the good of all of us that everyone heeds the messaging around fan behaviour so that we can continue to enjoy the games together.



It is good to see us in the top positions of the table and, most importantly, it is helping our commercial team of Debbie, Kerry and Martyn as we see lots of new names appearing in the many sponsorships at the club.

It has been good to see these new people, together with Peter Johnston, our catering manager and Stefanie McLean, our retail manager, who have introduced new and refreshing ideas at the club.

I was at the FA Youth Cup on Tuesday night and I really felt for Mark Birch and his team. They have had a fantastic start to the season and we all know that the result against Fleetwood was in no way a reflection of their potential. It seemed that the ball just wasn't going to go over the line, with us having had some excellent opportunities before Fleetwood got their penalty.

We have seen over the recent years that our academy is producing players, and that is testament to the coaches and staff through all of the age groups, and on to Paul Simpson who has made it clear by his actions that there is a pathway. I hope Tuesday's result is used as a learning tool and that the team kicks on again, starting today against Rotherham.

FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Good afternoon and welcome to today's FA Cup first-round game against Tranmere. I also welcome Micky, his staff and players for the second of our meetings in the space of a week.

I said before last weekend's game that the fact we're playing back-to-back fixtures doesn't really factor into today's game too much. Even though we've seen each other first-hand so recently, it still comes down to what happens on the day that counts.

Our players will be looking to continue the work rate, energy and positive approach that got them the win last Saturday, and I'm sure Tranmere will be looking to get back to the type of form that had seen them go on such an impressive run.

We know their threats, they know ours, so what happened in the previous 90 minutes just gone means nothing once the whistle goes today. If we're at it, we give ourselves a chance. That never changes.

Last Saturday's performance was important because we needed a response to what was a disappointing game at Stockport. We know as a collective that we didn't perform to the standard we demand of ourselves that night, and the important thing from that point is that you get a reaction.

Teams who want to do well provide a response to situations like that and every player played their part in what was a very strong team approach and,

importantly, they kept the energetic and front-foot tempo high for the remaining 90-plus minutes, having got themselves ahead so early.

There were a lot of good things to take from it, but I have to say that I was delighted for Kris Dennis that he took himself to ten for the season. That's a great return at this stage from a player who likes to score goals. With someone in that kind of form it gives everyone confidence, knowing that he'll be looking to get on the end of anything that goes into the box.

Another real positive was the number of Cumbrians, staff and players, we had involved on and off the pitch. That in no way suggests that those who aren't from the area are any less committed, we've seen quite clearly that isn't the case, but it's important for clubs like ours that we have that kind of community link. When we talk about building an identity it's things like this that help everybody to feel that they're part of something we hope will become special.

Enjoy the game.

There were two enforced changes for manager Paul Simpson from Stockport on Tuesday night, making four in total, with Jordan Gibson missing out to suspension having picked up his fifth yellow card, and Fin Back absent through illness. Jack Stretton and Jack Ellis were in as replacements.

Fit again Paul Huntington returned to the heart of the defence and Taylor Charters made his first league start of the season to make it four changes in total. Jayden Harris and Corey Whelan took a place on the bench.

That meant the side had four Cumbrians † starting (Charters, Ellis, Huntington and Moxon), and a Cumbrian manager and assistant manager, giving it very much a local feel.



It took just 39 seconds for the Blues to open their account when Jack Stretton † got onto the end of a superb ball forward from Guy. It was a raking, 60-yard pass and the striker put it on a plate for his partner, who had

followed the move, with a fizzing delivery. It was goal number nine of the season, this one from close range, for Dennis.

It was a really bright start from the away team and Mellish raced out of defence to control a touch from Charters on his chest with everyone looking to get onto the ball. Armer took over, and he quickly fed Mellish into space. A low cross was met by Dennis on the penalty spot but it was blocked by Simeu.

There was another half chance on 11 minutes when Feeney floated a free kick from deep into the mix. Charters nodded it down, and Dennis looked to connect on the volley. He was closed down just as he spun to hit it.

United thought they'd doubled their lead on 13 minutes when Charters, making his first league start since Newport away in October last year, got his head down to attack the box. He used Dennis as a bounce board, but his grasscutter was parried by Doohan.

Stretton popped it over the line but the flag went up for offside.



More good football saw Moxon spread it wide after Ellis had recovered possession. He got it back from † Jack Armer, and Guy pulled off his man to make an option. He had two defenders on his case and the shot skewed off the top of his boot.

Carlisle were on their game through the early stages and Ellis linked up with Dennis to get to the byeline. His cross fizzed across the face of the target as Armer and Stretton launched themselves at it.

A firm interception in his own half from Moxon sent Stretton through as the ball sailed high. He was suddenly up against Doohan, with the keeper getting a boot to it just in the nick of time.

United were dominant, and Guy was masterful in the way he wriggled away from three opponents before putting it into the box. Dennis had his back to goal, and he tried to bring Stretton into play with a light touch. The forward was muscled out of it before he could shoot.

Mellish was on hand to clear when Hawkes tried to cause problems with a clipped reverse pass inside the area, with Tranmere attacking in fits and starts, and Holý showed an excellent reaction when Morris got on the end of the resulting inswinging corner. It was going into the roof of the net until fingertips diverted it over.

The visitors came again when Stretton touched off a high ball for Guy to latch onto. A sprint opened things up but his curler could only find the side netting.

There was a Tranmere corner to deal with in time added on for the half, and Guy was flattened by Hemmings as he got the first contact. That was that at the end of what had been an immense 45 minutes from the away team.

Guy had to be replaced by Harris when he went to ground on 52 minutes, and the substitute was involved immediately as he got the ball out to Ellis. A foul on the youngster brought a free kick,

and that was delivered low by Moxon. Stretton was pushed to the floor by Nevitt as he looked to get there, and the whistle subsequently blew for a penalty. Kris Dennis † took himself into double figures with an excellently placed finish.



United had long throws and crosses to contend with through a tighter spell of the game, but Huntington and Mellish met everything, and Feeney chimed in with a storming run from the edge of his own box to relieve the pressure.

Jack Ellis brought the away fans to their feet when he nutmegged Bristow and battled his way into the box right in front of them. He popped it across the goal line but it was agonisingly just in front of Charters.

Morris fired wide with a snapshot as Tranmere were kept out of the area, and Simeu put a cross straight at Holý as the home crowd started to turn and lose their patience.

Holý was commanding at the back, punching and catching as required, and he was backed up by a 'whole team' performance through every area of the pitch.



Jon Mellish † picked up his fifth booking of the season in time added on, meaning he'll miss the trip to Harrogate, but even that couldn't put the dampeners on what was as good an away display as we are likely to see.

United registered their first league victory of the campaign as they dug deep to grind out an important result at the end of new manager Keith Curle's first week in charge.

United created a great opening with ten minutes on the clock when Amoo raced onto a pass from Dicker. He beat his man and popped a great ball into the box but Beck's downward header was put behind by the attentive Danny Holmes.

Carlisle looked lively and White advanced to support another good move when Amoo called for help. The right back sent a beauty of a cross to the far post and Fon Williams had to spread himself to make a block on the line.

Hanford did well to protect his lines as Tranmere got forward in numbers but it was all about United as they played with confidence and determination, particularly going forward.

The home side thought they'd taken the lead on 20 minutes when Beck threw himself at a cross from the right. His touch left Dicker with time and he wheeled away in disappointment as his thundering toe poke skipped up and behind off the top of the bar.

The good Carlisle work was almost undone on the half hour when Bell Baggie linked with Richards inside the box. The striker showed great awareness to hold onto the ball as he danced past two challenges to go one-on-one with Hanford. The United stopper earned a round of applause as he stepped out to make a fantastic save.

Another long ball put Donnelly up against Thirlwell and the striker opted to shoot early as they reached the edge of the box. Hanford was untroubled as it bobbed towards the corner flag.

Tranmere created a chance from nothing on 57 minutes when Donacien robbed Beck deep inside the Carlisle half. The cross eventually fell for Power and it needed a half block from Thirlwell to send Power's volley over the bar.

Patience was needed as chances became few and far between but Carlisle got their noses in front when **David Amoo** bobbed and weaved his way onto a corner delivery. His header had Fon Williams flapping at thin air as it dropped over the line and into the back of the goal.

Rovers were handed a gilt-edged opportunity to level the scores when Bell Baggie and Kirby picked a path to put the ball on a plate for Donnelly who was stationed in a good position on the penalty spot. He snatched at it and was immediately substituted as his woeful effort flew high into the air.

Carlisle continued to dictate the play as they kept the ball high up the field and, in the end, they thoroughly deserved their first win of what had been a difficult start to the campaign.

The boys done great

It's time to dust off the Carlisle United book of Superlatives. Magnificent! Tremendous! Good! Great! They're just some of the words which have been used to describe their recent achievement. But for the first half of the first half, the effects of United's enforced lay-off were evident as Tranmere began to exert some authority. Their incisive through balls and crosses were stretching the Carlisle defence, before United began to hit on the break.

Usually when a basement team raise an upset, it's due to a pitch like a ploughed field with a slope steeper than House Everest. But last night United triumphed with the unique tactic of being the better footballing side.

Up front, Alan Smart showed some exquisite touches while Lee Peacock ran himself into the ground. CARLISLE United were in blues heaven last night after taking the prized scalp of First Division Tranmere Rovers. A classic clash with Premiership big boys Sheffield Wednesday saw youth Mervyn Day's heroes after they booked their place in the FA Cup fourth round for the first time in over a decade. Brunton Park's biggest crowd of the season, 10,090, witnessed a rousing cup tie and a game which had everything.

Super Scot Owen Archdeacon scored United to victory with his 30th minute clincher. Midfielder Warren Aginal started the move, playing the ball forward to Lee Peacock, who had made a magnificent run forward. The young striker beat the off-side trap to send over a great cross which completely evaded the Tranmere defence and as Archdeacon sailed on to the lower half, he kept his head and was given time and space to pick his spot. United's wonder goal set up a nerve-racking finale but their reward of a place in the FA Cup was theirs with flying colours.

Waiting in particular show like a head-on in the back as Tranmere launched their frantic search for an equaliser, while in midfield Aginal must have covered every blade of grass in the United cause. But in the end, the visitors ended up shooting themselves in the foot.

Aldridge had Tranmere's best chance of the game in the 56th minute when a cross split by Pannawatch saw Jimmie Brannan cross.

CONNECTIONS WITH KEN WOOD



After ties in 1974 with the holders Sunderland and then Liverpool, a memorable decade was completed with our only quarter-final, when, as a First Division team, we disappointingly lost 0-1 here to Second Division Fulham.

In subsequent years United have again been pitted against Liverpool and Sunderland as well as Sheffield Wednesday and Everton.

I saw my first Brunton Park FA Cup tie in January 2001 when Arsène Wenger's star-studded Arsenal team progressed with a single goal from French international **Sylvain Wiltord** ← midway through the first half.

My first ever football memory was listening to a radio commentary of Arsenal v Blackpool in March 1953. Blackpool went on to win the trophy 4-3 in the 'Matthews Final', the first game I saw on television.

Stanley Matthews was English football's first celebrity player and that 1953 final possibly was the origin of the much used phrase 'the Magic of the FA Cup'.

The first round of the FA Cup brings together teams who would never otherwise play each other.

Last year Horsham came to Brunton Park while in 2020 our 'United' only just avoided the embarrassment of losing at Hayes & Yeading United. The Southern League side scored either side of half-time in extra time before Jon Mellish, in the final moments, saved our blushes and we eventually progressed 4-3 on penalties.

In 2019 our visit to Dulwich Hamlet was the BBC Friday night broadcast, the first tie of the round. Fela Olomola's 8th minute goal set us on our way to a 4-1 win.

After promotion in 1965, United came in at the third-round stage with the big name clubs. In 1970 capacity crowds squeezed into Brunton Park to see The Blues beat Nottingham Forest but lose to Middlesbrough.

United twice hosted Tottenham Hotspur, losing 2-3 in 1971 but drawing 1-1 at White Hart Lane in 1972 before Spurs won the replay 3-1. In 1973 a home tie with Arsenal revived memories of the famous 1950 games against the Gunners.

My own enthusiasm for the FA Cup was nurtured by qualifying round matches for my local Kent team Sheppey United as well as the televised Finals of the 1950s. I also remember some Gillingham cup ties of that period including a second-round game in 1961 when Southend United were leading 2-1 and fans started leaving just before the end. I stayed on to see the Gills score twice in the 90th minute to win 3-2!

The Midland League's Peterborough United joined the EFL in 1961 and their next FA Cup game was at Dover. The home fans sang the newly adopted team anthem, 'High Hopes' especially at half time when the Kent team led 1-0.

Peterborough ended those hopes with four second half goals. Much more recently I used the first-round weekends for some 'groundhopping' and in 2017 enjoyed Peterborough v Tranmere when Rovers earned a replay.



Today they are here for an all-League Two clash and the winners will face one more hurdle to join the 'big boys' in the third round.

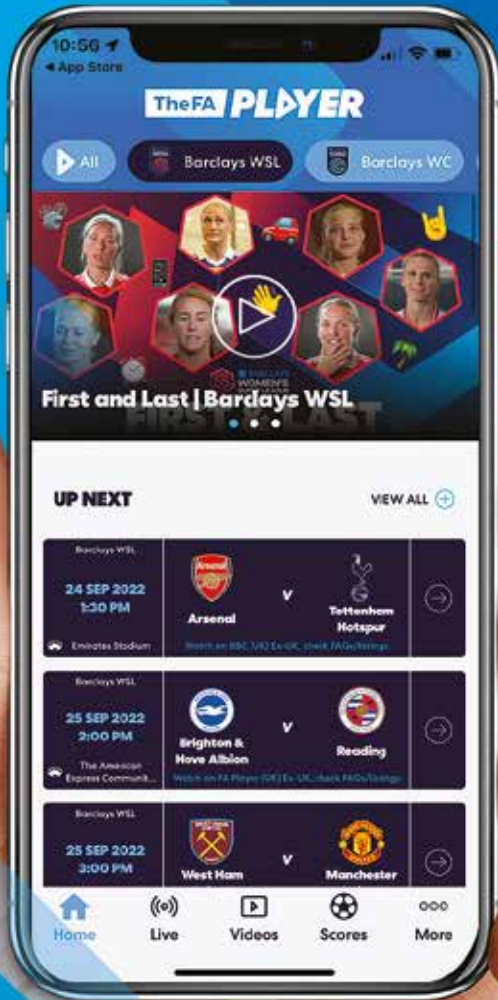
