FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

We welcome the directors, players and supporters of Walsall Football Club for this League Two game today.

I am sure it will be a competitive encounter as Walsall have the ex-Newport manager Michael Flynn in charge. He knows this level well, and he has built up a strong squad of players.

I would like to congratulate our manager and players who, in spite of a long list of injuries, managed to see us through to the next round of the FA Cup. We all know it isn't easy to beat Tranmere twice in a fortnight, so once again I say well done.

I understand that, after the recent game against Leyton Orient, we were invited to write to the powers that be to highlight if we had any problems regarding the officiating of the game that day.

This was done, and an apology was subsequently received when it was acknowledged that clear handball and offside decisions weren't given. It's obviously good to get a response, but these decisions led to a player being sent off directly after the handball, meaning a three-game suspension, and also the loss of three points to the club.



We all know it isn't easy for officials, but I feel huge efforts have to be made to improve the standards at all levels. It will only help all aspects of the game if this is achieved.



I suppose we were all hoping for another home draw in the FA Cup but, as I watched the balls come out of the hat, there was a real sense of – here we go again!

Knowing that we were playing Walsall today, and seeing their name still in there with ours, it was almost inevitable that it was going to be a repeat of what happened with Tranmere. On this occasion there's a fortnight's gap between the games, but it's still very strange to see this happen in both the first and second round.

As with today, it won't be easy, but with our present form, and with players gradually coming back to fitness, we will give it a good go to try to progress in the competition.

At Harrogate on Tuesday night I think it's fair to say that we all left feeling frustrated. Having said that, it was good to see that the players never gave up, and they got the reward for that with a late equaliser. I agree with Paul when he said that we probably didn't deserve to win the game and, when that's the case, it's important not to lose.

Yet again backed by fantastic away support we dug something out, and hopefully we will be back to our best again this afternoon so that we can add to that point with another home win.

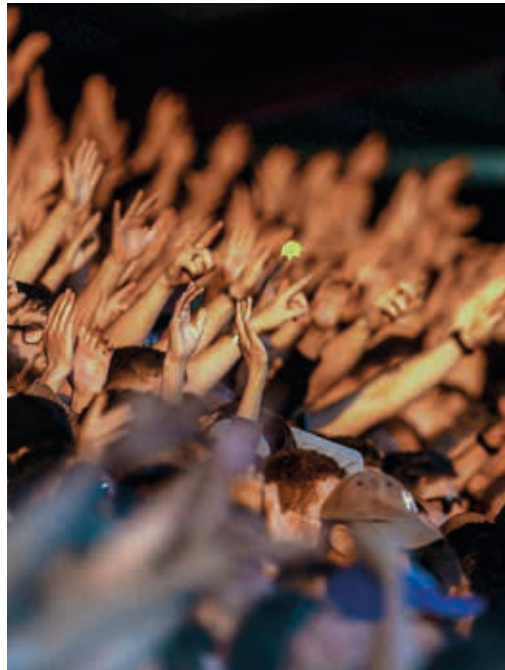
A message about anti-social and criminal behaviour

FROM THE MANAGER

Good afternoon and welcome to today's home game against Walsall. I also welcome Michael, his staff and players for what I expect will be a tough game between two sides in good form.

It must be strange, as it has turned out for us this season on two occasions in the FA Cup, for a team to be drawn to play against opposition they face in league action in such quick succession but, and as we said when it happened with Tranmere, it's simply the way things have worked out.

When you think about it, it's no different to going to a replay, and we know that one game has no real bearing on the other. It will always come down to who performs on the day that decides where the win goes.

We saw that down in Tranmere where a very strong 90-minute display earned us the three points in front of an unbelievable travelling support. The big thing we spoke about was carrying that on and into last weekend's FA Cup tie, and it was pleasing to see that the energy levels remained high.

Their goal gave them a lift in the second half, but defensively we were solid and we were comfortable and good for the two-goal lead we'd established off the back of yet another disciplined approach.

The last thing we said to the players before they went out for kick-off last Saturday was that it was going to come down to which team showed the right mentality, and it was about finding a way to get the result.

The atmosphere you created helped with that, and the positivity we all felt from it was seen in the way we kept pushing forward at every opportunity.

At Harrogate on Tuesday night we came away feeling frustrated, along with an understanding that it is always a difficult place to go. Obviously it was good not to lose the game, and the way we kept going right to the very end was pleasing, but we know that if we'd been at the levels we've shown we can reach then there was an opportunity there for us to pick up three points.

It wasn't to be, and it's important now that having looked at the things we did well, and at the areas we need to work on, we take the lessons from it into the important games to come. We are in a good position in the league, and in the second round of the cup, and those are good building blocks at this stage of the season.

The support both home and away has been excellent. Thank you. Let's keep doing it together.

United's first game of the 2021 new year was at the Bescot Stadium, with Walsall the hosts.

United started on the front foot with Charters sneaking in to steal possession inside the home half. Kayode was able to give it back to the young midfielder and he looked up to shoot from distance. He put his boot through it but it was always heading wide.

Good footwork from Kayode and Patrick followed, but the shot was blocked at source and the Blues had to build again. They did that as Charters arrived late, with possession having been turned over once more, but his volley sailed over the bar.

Walsall showed on 25 minutes with a raking crossfield pass that was taken out of the air by

Norman. He clipped it past Patrick and rolled it back towards the edge of the area. Scarr went for a shot on the run but it spooned into the air and Farman gathered it in. His quick release ended with **Omari Patrick** stroking the visitors into the lead.



The influential **Taylor Charters** was having a league starting debut to remember and he earned his team a corner as he went past a man to put a pass into the centre. That delivery from Guy somehow skipped past everybody.

More close pressing won the ball back for the Blues from the corner clearance, and Kayode was suddenly clean through as a lobbed pass from Patrick outwitted the back line. Roberts raced out to spread himself and he got enough of a hand to it to prevent a certain goal.

A tight start to the second period saw Gordon booked for a late challenge on Patrick, and Guy drilled one over the bar as he looked to make an impact.

Carlisle went close on 56 minutes when Kayode linked with Alessandra in midfield. He popped it through to Riley, who got his head down on the angle before aiming for the bottom corner. He connected well but he dragged it past the upright.

United had a shot from Charters cleared off the line from a corner as Roberts spilled it when it was guided back into the box by Armer.

Armer slipped a pass through to Alessandra late in the day, and he used Kayode with a lovely touch. Another precise through ball set Riley free and clear on the right flank, and his pull back eventually came to Kayode. The big striker didn't get the cleanest of strikes, but that didn't matter as his volley skipped of the surface and left Roberts flapping at thin air.

The hard work continued until the final whistle which, with the Forest Green game against Oldham abandoned early in the second half due to freezing fog, saw the Cumbrians head into the New Year in top spot.

Good afternoon, and welcome to today's match against Walsall.

This season we've continued our inclusion work across Carlisle offering opportunities to people with different needs, from other cultures, communities and a variety of ages making sure our projects and programmes are accessible to all.

Our Premier League Kicks programme runs throughout the season across many areas of Carlisle looking to give opportunity to children and young people (8-18 years) to take part in evening sessions involving sporting and non-sporting activities to help inspire them to see their full potential.

Our Kicks sessions help participants improve their social skills, physical health, mental health and self-esteem. While attending our Kicks sessions our participants also are encouraged to get involved in social action volunteering. This season has seen our young people help collect donations for local food banks, raise money for Children in Need and environmental projects such as litter picking and gardening, helping to rejuvenate their local communities.

We hold these sessions working alongside Richard Rose Central Academy, Richard Rose Morton Academy, William Howard, Caldew, Newman and at Carlisle Youth Zone.

We hold weekly football pan disability sessions at Carlisle Youth Zone working with children, teenagers and adults. These sessions look to offer players the opportunity to improve their footballing skills while also being an incredibly welcoming environment for those who just want to come down and have some fun. Each session starts with a fun warm up activity combining movement and agility skills, then we work on football specific skills using a variety of games to help improve dribbling, passing and shooting skills. We always finish with a match and a crossbar challenge or penalty shootout at halftime for extra points. Our disability participants have enjoyed bowling Christmas parties, stadium tours and competing in matches, tournaments and competitions against other disability teams.

We are excited to have created a new partnership with Pennine Lodge Residents Home. Community staff will attend weekly visits carrying out seated exercises, games and activities hoping to improve residents' mobility and social interaction. We have also teamed up with 'Playlist for Life' who use Spotify to create memory playlists with the aim to stimulate fond memories for the residents through music.

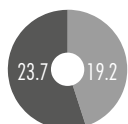

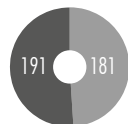

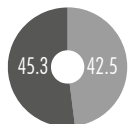

At the start of the season, I rashly promised to look back over World Cup years as an entrée to the feast of football that FIFA is promising from Qatar.

However, over the past 50 years, we've suffered disillusion and disappointment every four years. Scotland kept inventing new ways of failing to reach the quarter-finals and, since their supporting role in France in 1998, have been edged out in the qualifiers by the ever increasing number of European nations.

England often made good progress but with the TV pundits banging on about the glories of 1966, have been unable to fulfil the nation's expectations.

The 2006 version was a typical example. The saga unfolded from 2000 when, after England's bid to host the event had been eliminated in the first round of voting, Oceania delegate, Charlie Dempsey then abstained, and Germany edged out South Africa 12-11 to spark subsequent allegations of bribery and corruption.

In May 2006 the headlines were all about Wayne Rooney's metatarsal, but he recovered just in time to take his place in Sven Goran Eriksson's England squad. The team failed to impress but a deflection for an off David Beckham's third minute free kick was enough to beat Paraguay.

Next came a stuttering 2-0 win over Trinidad and Tobago, earned by late goals from Peter Crouch and Steven Gerrard. With a last 16 place virtually assured, a draw with Sweden was enough to top the group.

Joe Cole's 34th minute goal was equalised by Allback (50) but Gerrard restored the lead with five minutes left. Henrik Larsson's last-minute goal changed the points totals but not the positions, so Sweden had to play Germany and lost 2-0, while Becks scored the only England goal against Ecuador.

The red mist descended as Portugal v Holland ended 1-0 on goals and 2-2 on red cards. With Costinha and Deco suspended, Portugal held England to a 0-0 draw, Rooney was sent off for stamping and

'Phil' Scolari's team won the shoot-out 3-1, Ricardo saving three England efforts.

The tournament was producing red and yellow cards rather than exciting goals and in the Final, France had Zidane sent off for a head butt, reacting to an offensive remark by Italy's Materazzi near the end of a 1-1 draw, the Italians winning on spot kicks.

'Back home' to quote the title of our 1970 World Cup song is where we all end up after the tournament, and back home 2006 was a good year at Brunton Park.

We even celebrated after a 2-1 loss to Torquay as promotion was assured. The M6 was busy as we went to Rochdale to win the title and again at Stockport as Blues fans boosted the crowd to over 10,000. Top scorer Karl Hawley was a product of the Walsall nursery and our Spanish defender **Zigor Aranalde** † had played 195 games for the Saddlers. Paul Simpson also had a spell at the Bescot Stadium on loan from Wolves.

2006 was not such a good year for Walsall who came down from League 1 as Carlisle went up. Both clubs have had ups and downs in the subsequent years and have met in League 2 since Walsall's 2019 relegation.

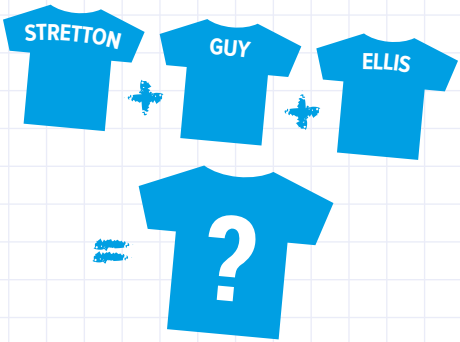


