At the time of writing nothing has been finalised, but hopefully by the time you read these notes the position will be sorted as we are all working hard to achieve our goal.

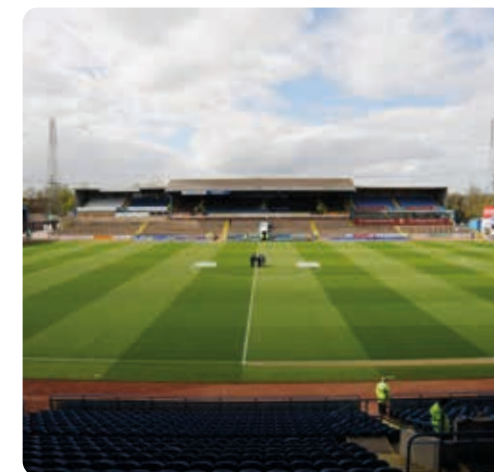
I would also like to thank the supporters who have played their part at games both home and away and in growing numbers. I am sure on away games like Barrow and Harrogate the numbers would have been bigger,

United were on the road for the second time in the space of four days as they headed south to face Stevenage.

United should have scored with just two minutes on the clock when Devine picked out Gibson on the right. His cross took a wicked deflection, but it found Dickenson at the back stick as it skipped off the greasy surface. He took a touch before putting a boot through it, but he got his bearings wrong and he could only find the side netting.

Boro responded with a good move down the left as Coker overlapped. Norris challenged in the box, but he was under pressure from Feeney and his header went over the bar.

A 19-yard free kick blasted into the wall as Lines and Norris worked out a training ground routine for the home side, and the follow up from Reeves took a touch off McDonald as it zipped over the target.

United were sliced open on the quarter hour when Lines put a low free kick into the box. Taylor swivelled sharply and curled the ball at the top corner with the outside of his boot. Howard was equal to it, and he spread his arms to make the save.

List was next to have a go with a deflected 19-yard attempt that twisted past the post. He let go after the ball had unexpectedly come his way.

A floated cross from Reeves found Taylor at the far post, and his downward header fell kindly for Read. He had to readjust, and that allowed McDonald to close the gap.

Dickenson and Guy matched runs as they surged onwards just before the break, and they made it behind the back line with plenty in the box. Devine checked his movement, and it came his way as he lined himself up. A touch from a defender was enough to take the sting out of it.

Howard was needed again at the other when List and Norris exchanged passes on their way to the danger area. It was List who had the rasper, and the deflection appeared to have wrong-footed the stopper. He recovered acrobatically to palm it over the bar.

Mellish was felled as the ball came his way on 43 minutes, and Guy took charge of the set piece. It was a beauty, and Mellor brought a fine save from Anang with a thumping header. It bounced down off the bar, and **Jon Mellish** was there to bag his third of the season from close range.



The lead was almost doubled in the first minute of the second half when Dickenson crossed at the second attempt. Mellish watched it on its way, and **Sam Fishburn** reacted first to gather the loose ball. He shot low but Anang was there to grasp it.

United defended well, with Howard on the end of three crosses from wide, and the away side had moments of their own as Dickenson pulled wide to try to find Fishburn and Mellish from good situations.

United were awarded a penalty on 62 minutes when Gibson skipped his way into the box. He was chopped down by Prosser and the whistle was blown immediately.

Jodan Gibson dusted himself off to take it, and he sent the away fans behind the goal wild when he safely tucked it into the bottom corner. It was, for the record, his fifth of the season.

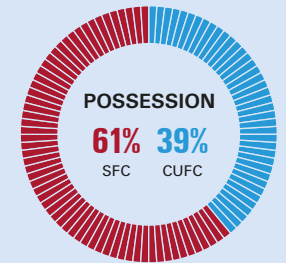
Mellish had a snapshot deflect over the bar, and a pass from Gibson bounced awkwardly over Dickenson's head as the visitors looked to extend their cushion.

It became a very solid away display with very little purchase for the hosts, and Howard was comfortable again when a Norris header came his way with two minutes left to go.

The Cumbrians saw it through, and the 220 strong travelling contingent were able to celebrate with the usual round of festive chants.

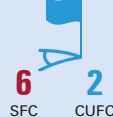

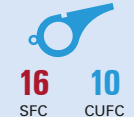

ATTENDANCE





Our first connection with today's visitors was the 2004/5 Conference season. After the January flood, United's winless run stretched to nine games, the last two of which were 2-1 defeats inflicted by Stevenage Borough.

From top of the table in mid-December we had slumped to tenth. Eight wins from twelve to complete the campaign earned the consolation prize of the play-offs.

After the excitement of the penalty shoot-out with Aldershot – Matty Glennon surely joined our Goalkeepers' Hall of Fame – it was off to Stoke for the final. Peter Murphy's goal made it third time lucky for United against Stevenage and Paul Simpson's team won another promotion a year later as EFL League Two champions.

Borough had to wait another five years to join the EFL but did it in style with 99 points. They would have set a Conference points' record except for the loss of six points gained against Chester City who were subsequently expelled. The next season Stevenage won promotion via the play-offs to join us in League One.

I enjoyed my one visit to their Lamex Stadium on the opening day of the season in August 2012. On the train, my phone conversation about my match ticket was overheard by a group from the London Supporters Branch who invited me to join them at the pub garden adopted by the Carlisle fans including the busloads from Cumbria. In heatwave conditions, the game was split into four quarters for water breaks.

This year's connections were initially not good – poor results and games off due to Covid. Carlisle opted for a new manager and, after Paul's immediate run of wins left Stevenage trailing near the foot of the table, they did likewise, replacing Paul Tisdale with Steve Evans on 16 March.

He didn't achieve success until recent wins against Colchester and Rochdale. Oldham too changed manager and appointed John Sheridan – remember him? Undefeated in seven games until our stoppage time winner at Boundary Park on 5 March. Oldham have won only one game since, 1-0 at Stevenage. Members of the Football League since 1907, 'The Latics' are now confirmed to go down to the National League along with Scunthorpe United.

Barrow too changed their manager when United beat them on 19 March, Phil Brown taking over from Mark Cooper. Their remarkable 4-0 thrashing of Forest Green Rovers and a draw at Salford may have eased the pain of other disappointing results.

A connection for all clubs is the team bus. I remember the Stevenage driver complaining one Tuesday night at Brunton Park about not getting home until 3am. Carlisle's trips that season included Portsmouth, Plymouth, Exeter and Newport, as well as eight grounds within 30 miles or so of London.

Steve Murray drove the CUFC bus a few years ago and now drives for D&E Coaches of Inverness. I met him and his wife Sam when they took my Wick Academy team on our longest Highland League trip, 480 miles to and from Brechin.

I'm really looking forward to being at Brunton Park today, only my fourth visit this season. Next week I hope to go to the Bradford City game, making Valley Parade number 153 on my UK 'ground-hopping' list.

Let's hope that next season we'll be at the top end of the table with other northern teams.

MORECAMBE 1 – 2 CARLISLE UNITED

Thursday 14 April 2022



United's final Central League Cup group game was away to Morecambe, and the Blues went into it with one win and one defeat under their belts - against Fleetwood and Preston respectively - and knowing that they needed a victory to make it through to the area semi-final.

First-team squad members Gime Touré and Josh Dixon were given another opportunity to get some valuable pitch time, with the remainder of the team made up of youth first and second year players.

The first chance of the day went to the Blues as Bollado fed Touré with a decent ball. A touch was followed by a shot from distance but it bounced just wide of the upright.

An excellent through ball from Watt released Touré once again moments later, and he jinked his way past a challenge before letting fly from 12-yards. The keeper dived low to tip it round the upright.

The Shrimps got forward with purpose on nine minutes as they edged their way through the middle of the park. It opened up and an effort from range had to be gathered by Simons.

There was a superb save from the Morecambe stopper when Watt beat the offside trap to go clean through. He had just one thing on his mind as he unleashed a thunderbolt, but the keeper showed strong hands to beat it away.

Watt rifled another fierce rocket wide from the edge of the area as the Blues dictated the pace, but the Shrimps sent a reminder that it wasn't going to be an easy afternoon with a cross from the right flank which flashed untouched across the face of the target.

A huge ball over the top caused problems for the reds when Bollado used his strength to put pressure on the back line. He got the slightest of touches but the stopper was alert and he got a boot to it to prevent it from going over the line.

Morecambe went close when unexpected space brought a pilderiver from 22-yards, but it was always heading high and Simons was able to watch as it sailed into the ether.

Half chances came and went for United, with Dixon and Touré both having a go, and it was the Blues who ended the first period on the front-foot when Fishburn and Touré exchanged passes inside the box. The latter tried to finish the move off but his volley lacked power.

The hosts came out of the dressing room fired up and a cheeky back heel from a corner that had been nodded back into the mix dropped just over the Carlisle crossbar.

A run from Touré took him past two, but a low punt was straight at the keeper as United tried to get themselves going.

And the Shrimps claimed the lead on 54 minutes when a ball over the top was taken under control inside the area. A ripping volley from a tight angle bulged the inside of the net as Simons tried to get there.

There was real concern for the Cumbrians when midfielder Josh Dixon went down with a loud scream by Mason Hardy as his treatment continued by the side of the pitch. He was eventually taken down the tunnel looking visibly upset.

Carlisle pulled level on 70 minutes when Kilsby ghosted into the box. His crunching attempt was parried, but Watt was there to follow up after Touré had kept it alive. He beat the keeper, but not the post, but Fishburn was there to guide it into the waiting net.

The Blues were suddenly rejuvenated and Kilsby blazed over from close range when he found himself unmarked as he arrived at the far post to meet a deep delivery.

But Simons needed to be at his best when red shirts flooded forward. A fizzed strike was top corner bound until the agile keeper went full length to claw it away.

The Morecambe glovesman was excellent yet again late in the day when he somehow got to a Fishburn grasscutter that looked to be a certain goal. A firm hand got there to scoop it away.

United saw the game out and it's on to Preston North End in the competition's semi-final.

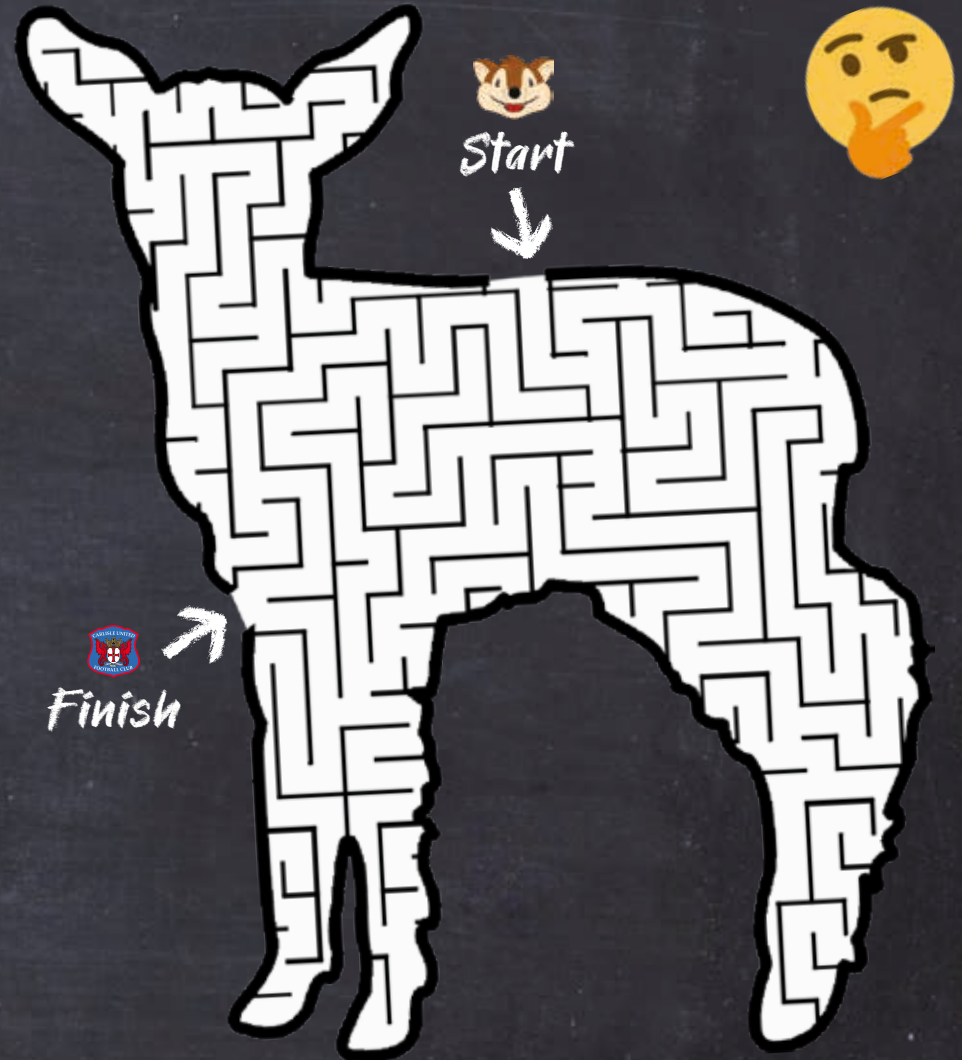

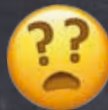



A STEEP LEARNING CURVE



Supporter Liaison Officer (SLO) Simon Clarkson looks back at his first season in the role.

The main facet of the SLO role is to be an enabler, so that fans can contact the club, receive answers to questions and communicate any requests or concerns regarding supporter issues. One of my main challenges was to develop good relationships with club staff. I attend pre-match briefings, so that I can understand key messages to relay to fans and having taken the information, clarify key points.

A joined-up communication plan looks to avoid any confusion and emphasise the important points to get across. I try to take the bones out of articles and summarise in short, simple messages on social media. Those messages are often taken from issues that fans have raised to me. The primary areas have tended to be ticketing where we had some major problems in the early season and catering where having taken the operation in house.

The expanded outside food hub has gone down well with fans, with the SLO team being eyes and ears, to give instant feedback from fans. The bars have been busier with the increased use of contactless payment reducing queue times which is a real positive. There has been a steady up take in the use of the catering click and collect app. We still have lots to do but the feedback in general has been positive.

Keith Elliott has done an excellent job as the away SLO. We know what a dramatic difference it can make for our travelling fans when they know what to expect on our away trips. Early engagement with host SLO's can draw out valuable information buried in the ground guides. Whether that be catering options, car parking, road closures or ticket information, we have found that short simple messages go down well with fans.

Gathering feedback is key and so far, it has been positive, with a significant increase in followers and interactions.

The trip to Forest Green Rovers (FGR) was a case in point. Keith circulated key information on social media about a lack of coach parking, a very steep hill to walk up, no access for away fans into the only bar at the ground and no programmes being produced. It is well known about vegan only options but that was still a key message to share. We passed on the concerns raised by our fans, that together with feedback from other clubs, led to FGR appointing a fan experience officer.

The most important part of the SLO role is visibility at home games. I am indebted to the meeters and greeters who have a key role in being approachable for fans around Brunton Park. As Geoff and Andrew from the team step down after several years of dedicated service, I am excited about some new team members joining us. Yes, we already planning for season 22/23 and look forward to seeing you all again.

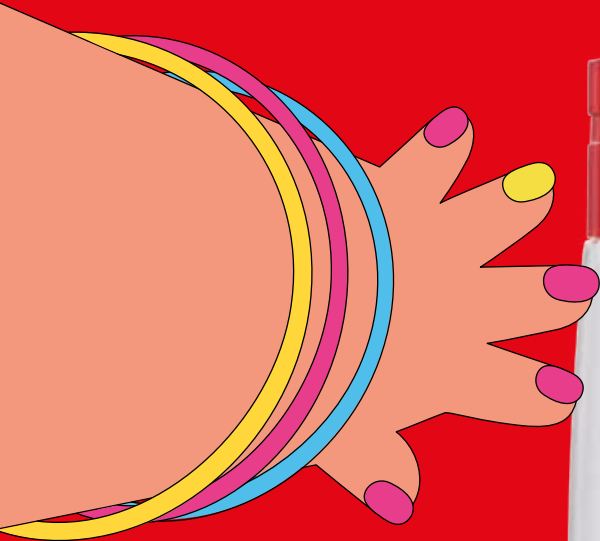
